## NOTES ON THE DUKES

### WEEK 11

#### JMU STORYLINES

- Senior defensive end Arthur Moats (Portsmouth, Va.) has 11 quarterback sacks, one off Chris Morant's (1998-2000). JMU season record of 12 sacks, set in 1999 when he was the Atlantic 10 defensive player of the year. Moats this season has set JMU's season record for tackles for loss with 23.5. He is four sacks off Morant's JMU career mark of 33 sacks.
- JMU against Towson will be seeking to secure a winning season record for the sixth-straight year and complete its seventh-straight year with at least a .500 mark. JMU hadn't had as many as five-straight winning seasons or gone as many as six years with at least a .500 mark before its recent successful period.
- Senior cornerback Scotty McGee (Virginia Beach, Va.) has six career kick returns for scores, one off the NCAA FCS career mark. He is tied for JMU's career marks for punt returns for touchdown and kickoff returns for scores (three of each).
- Scotty McGee has a career kickoff return average of 30.1 yards, easily better than JMU's No. 2 career mark of 28.1 yards by Dwight Robinson (1991-94).
- Senior tight end Mike Caussin (Springfield, Va.) has 934 career receiving yards and needs 66 yards on receptions to become the 18th JMU player and the second Dukes tight end to reach the 1,000-yard career receiving plateau.
- Quarterback Justin Thorpe (Richmond, Va.) this season has a JMU freshman-quarterback-record 622 rushing yards. He is 69 yards shy of Warren Marshall's (1982-86) No. 2 overall season rushing yards mark (691) by a JMU freshman.
- JMU is allowing an average of 289.8 yards per contest of total offense this season, a mark it has bettered only three times since 1988 (284.8 in 2000, 287.8 in 2005, 280.4 in 2006). JMU allowed fewer than 300 yards per game for six straight years from 1985-90 -- 284.3 in 1985, 283.9 in 1986, 291.7 in 1987, 281.0 in 1988, 290.4 in 1989, and 291.8 in 1990. The Dukes' 9-0-1 Division II team in 1975 allowed an average of 270.0 yards per game.

#### THE SERIES

JMU and Towson first met in 1976 before either moved to the scholarship level, and they met every season from then through 1992 except for 1980.

JMU leads the series 15-5-1, has a 9-1 lead in games at JMU, has won the last five games overall and the last six at JMU, and won 58-27 last year at Towson.

The teams quit playing after the 1992 season when JMU began competing in the then-Yankee Conference and Towson moved from the scholarship level, and they resumed the series in 2004 when the Tigers began playing in the then-Atlantic 10 Conference. JMU has won each of the five meetings -- all to close regular-season play -- since the teams started meeting as league opponents.

JMU won 31-17 at Towson in 2004 to close a 9-2 season and claim a share of the Atlantic 10 title with a 7-1 mark. The Dukes went on to win that year's NCAA Division I-AA title. JMU sealed 2006, 2007 and 2008 playoff bids by winning its final regular-season games against the Tigers.

Tony LeZotte (2004-07) set JMU's record for longest interception return with a 100-yarder against Towson in 2005, and the Tigers' Tony Vinson set JMU opponent game records of 41 rushing attempts and 264 rushing yards in the team's 1992 game.

#### LAST SEASON'S MEETING

**JMU 58, TU 27 (11/22/08)**

JMU completed the winningest regular season in its history with the victory. The win raised the Dukes' overall record to 10-1 and their Colonial Athletic Association mark to 8-0, was their 10th straight victory and gave them the CAA title. The out-right league crown was the first for JMU in Division I play.

JMU led 37-13 at halftime and 51-13 after three quarters, compiled 528 yards of total offense, had two players with three touchdowns, and had two 100-yard rushers.

Rodney Landers ran for 117 yards and three touchdowns and hit on nine of 12 passes for 86 yards and a score to lead JMU. Eugene Holloman ran for 131 yards and Griff Yancey for three scores.

Landers during the game reached the 3,000-yard career rushing yards mark (3,084) and the 6,000-yard career total offense mark (6,074) and moved to within 10 yards of 3,000 career passing yards. Only four players in FCS history had reached 3,000 yards in both career rushing and passing.

Landers ran 29 yards for a touchdown on JMU's first series, scored from one yard early during the second quarter to give JMU a 20-7 advantage and had a four-yard touchdown run with 0:50 left in the first half for JMU's 37-13 lead. He also connected with Mike Caussin on a five-yard scoring pass during the second period.

Holloman had his second straight 100-yard game, following a 130-yard performance the previous week against William & Mary.

Yancey, who ran eight times for 60 yards, had scoring carries of four yards during the second quarter and 13 and two yards during the third.

JMU compiled 440 yards rushing and 88 passing overall and had a 463-207 edge in yards of total offense by the end of the third period.

The Dukes scored on their first series, moving 87 yards in four plays to set the tone for their offense for the afternoon, but Towson responded with a four-play, 67-yard scoring drive to lead 7-6 after its first series.

Landers got JMU's first points on his 29-yard scoring run after he hit Caussin on a 36-yard pass and Holloman ran 30 yards earlier during the series.

JMU took a 20-7 by the opening minute of the second quarter on Landers' scoring toss to Caussin and the quarterback's one-yard touchdown run, but

Towson got to within 20-13 with 11:07 left in the half on an eight-yard scoring run by quarterback Sean Schaefer.

The Dukes then closed the opening first half with a 17-0 scoring burst, getting a 43-yard field goal from Dave Stannard after a 36-yard Yancey kickoff return, a 29-yard touchdown drive after Towson failed to get a first down on a fourth-and-one play, and a 53-yard scoring drive after a short punt.

JMU lost a fumble at the Towson 10 during its initial series of the final half but had touchdowns drives of 66 and 56 yards later during the third quarter.

Schaefer, who threw for 315 yards while completing 27 of 48 pass attempts, threw two touchdown passes during the fourth quarter before JMU's Jon Rose scored from 10 yards for the contest's final points.

### TOWSON'S LAST GAME

Chris Whitney threw for two touchdowns and caught a scoring pass as Colonial Athletic Association co-leader Villanova won 49-7 at Towson.

Villanova scored touchdowns on its first five possessions and won for the fourth-straight time while improving to 9-1 for the season. The loss was Towson's fifth straight and dropped the Tigers to 2-8 for the year.

Villanova led 21-0 after one quarter, 35-0 at halftime and 49-0 midway through the third period.

Whitney caught a 13-yard pass option pass for a touchdown from Matt Szczur on the Wildcats' second series and then threw scoring passes of 17 yards to Mikey Reynolds and 24 yards to Norman White for a 28-0 Wildcat lead with 12:25 left in the first half.

Aaron Ball scored on runs of eight and four yards for Villanova, and Antwon Young had an 82-yard scoring carry for the Wildcats, who had 430 yards of offense to Towson's 225.

Tremayne Dameron scored Towson's touchdown on one-yard run with 2:47 left

in the third quarter. The Tigers drove 73 yards in 10 plays.

Villanova ran for 282 yards and threw for 148 yards. Eleven Wildcats had rushing attempts, and nine caught passes.

Whitney hit on six of seven passes for 93 yards before leaving the game midway through the second quarter. Young hit on four of six passes for 42 yards.

Towson's Brian Potts completed 21 of 31 passes for 177 yards, and Casey Cegles had eight receptions for 64 yards.

### SCOUTING TOWSON

The Tigers last week fell 49-7 at home to nationally ranked Villanova, suffering their fifth-straight loss and falling to 2-8 overall and to 1-6 in the Colonial Athletic Association. Last week's game was the third straight for Towson against a team ranked in the top five nationally.

Towson, which is playing for the first time this season under 1993 Towson graduate Rob Ambrose, averages 13.6 points and 251.0 yards of total offense per game (106.7 rushing, 144.3 passing) and allows averages of 35.9 points and 355.1 yards (175.9 rushing, 179.2 passing).

The Tigers have been hampered by injuries, particularly on offense, this season. They've used 10 offensive line starters and lost quarterback starter Peter Athens to a knee injury in the sixth game. Towson averaged 18.0 points and 285.0 yards through six games and has averaged 7.0 points and 200.0 yards since.

Tremayne Dameron has run for a team-high 521 yards and six touchdowns, and the Tigers have had six players throw passes. David Newsom with 27 catches for 375 yards and five scores is the receiving leader.

Linebacker Danzel White is among the CAA's tackles leaders with 105.

### JMU VS. NO. 1-RANKED FOES

JMU after falling 21-17 to Richmond Oct. 10 has a 3-4 record against teams ranked No. 1 in one of the major Football Championship Subdivision/Division I-AA polls. JMU is 1-2 in games on its field, 2-1 on opponents' fields and 0-1 at a neutral site.

JMU's other home games were a 30-24 loss in during the 1995 season to McNeese State and in 2008 when JMU rallied from a 21-0 halftime deficit to defeat Appalachian State 35-32. JMU led the McNeese State contest 24-6 at halftime.

The neutral-site game was during the 1985 season JMU and No. 1 Richmond played in the Oyster Bowl Game in Norfolk.

### JMU VS. DEFENDING CHAMPS

JMU after its Oct. 10 game with Richmond has a 3-7 record against teams that won the Division I-AA/Football Championship Subdivision championship the previous season. The Dukes are 2-2 in games on their field and 1-5 on opponents' fields.

JMU has met Georgia Southern four times when the Eagles were was the defending champion, and JMU's last two games against the previous season's champion had been against Appalachian State. The most-recent was a year ago when JMU beat the visiting Mountaineers 35-32.

### CAA FOOTBALL

JMU and the other 11 former members of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference first played in the Colonial Athletic Association in 2007. The CAA took control of the league between the 2006 and the 2007 seasons.

The CAA formed in June 1985 but had not previously sponsored football as a conference sport. JMU and football-playing members Delaware, Hofstra, Northeastern, Towson, and William & Mary are full CAA members. The football affiliation's other six participants -- Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Richmond, and Villanova -- compete as CAA associate members.

What became CAA football originated as the Yankee Conference in 1947. The Yankee Conference first was an all-sports league but in 1978, with the formation of the NCAA's Division I-AA, became a football-only affiliation. The Yankee Conference teams and several additions began playing in the Atlantic 10 for the 1997 season.

JMU affiliated with the conference in 1991 and began playing a league schedule in the 1993. JMU, Northeastern, and William & Mary were admitted to the league in 1991.

### UNBEATEN IN 2008 CAA PLAY

JMU completed its 2008 Colonial Athletic Association schedule with a perfect 8-0 conference record. The league previously had had five teams finish a season 8-0.

Massachusetts during the 2006 season had been the most-recent team to finish with an 8-0 league record. Other 8-0 conference teams have included Villanova in 1997, Delaware in 1995 season, New Hampshire in 1994, and Boston University in 1993.

JMU has been 7-1 in conference play three times -- in 1999, 2004 and 2006. JMU tied for the 1999 and 2004 league titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs each time, winning the national title in 2004.

### JMU FOOTBALL HISTORY

The 2009 season is JMU's 38th season of football, its 36th varsity football season, its 31st season with football scholarship players and its 30th season competing at what is now the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level, formerly Division I-AA.

JMU began football in 1972, moved to a recognized varsity schedule in 1974, first awarded scholarships for the 1979 season and moved to Division I-AA in 1980. JMU moved from Division III to Division I in 1979 and to then-Division I-AA for the 1980 season.

JMU's top seasons in addition to winning the 2004 NCAA Division I-AA

championship (13-2) have been in 2008 when the Dukes reached the FCS semifinals as the playoffs' top-seeded team and compiled a 12-2 record, 2007 (8-4, NCAA playoffs), 2006 (9-3, NCAA playoffs), 1999 (8-4, NCAA playoffs), 1995 (8-4, NCAA playoffs), 1994 (10-3, NCAA playoffs, second round), 1991 (9-4, NCAA playoffs, second round), 1987 (9-3, NCAA playoffs), 1982 (8-3), 1978 (8-2, No. 9, Division III), and 1975 (9-0-1, College Division).

### JORDAN ACTIVE WITH EAGLES

Former JMU linebacker Akeem Jordan (2003-06), the 2006 Atlantic 10 Football Conference defensive player of the year, was added to the Philadelphia Eagles' 53-man roster Oct. 29, 2007 and assumed a starting linebacker role with the team before season's end. He had been with the team's practice unit after joining the squad for preseason drills and continues to fill a prominent for the Eagles.

Jordan took part in 140 tackles at JMU in 2006 when he was national defensive player of the year by College Sporting News and runner-up for the Buck Buchanan Award and was named to three first All-America teams.

Jordan was a member of JMU's 2004 NCAA Division I-AA title team and its 2006 NCAA playoff team.

### SKOLNITSKY WITH REDSKINS

Former JMU defensive lineman J.D. Skolnitsky (2006-08) signed as a free agent with the Washington Redskins in May and was with the team throughout the preseason practice period.

Skolnitsky was cut Sept. 5 when National Football League teams were required to reduce their rosters to 53 players but was resigned to the Redskins' practice squad Sept. 6.

Skolnitsky sat out the 2005 season at JMU as a freshman redshirt but then was a member of three NCAA playoff squads.

Last season Skolnitsky started each JMU game at defensive tackle. He took part in 61 tackles, including 22 unassisted stops, 10.5 for loss and 4.5 quarterback sacks.

### FORMER JMU STANDOUTS

In addition to the former Dukes recently active with professional football organizations, JMU's leading all-time performers include several other players who have enjoyed success in the NFL – placekicker Scott Norwood (1978-81), wide receiver Gary Clark (1980-83), defensive end Charles Haley (1982-85), linebacker Dion Foxx (1990-93), wide receiver Macey Brooks (1993-96), running back Curtis Keaton (1998-99), tight end Ed Perry (1993-96) and return specialist Delvin Joyce (1997-2000).

**Norwood** received All-Pro honors as a placekicker with the Buffalo Bills.

**Clark** was All-Pro with the Washington Redskins and a member of two Super Bowl title teams and later played with the Arizona Cardinals and Miami Dolphins. He was selected in the first round of the first United States Football League draft in 1984.

**Haley** was the first player to be a member of five Super Bowl title teams while playing with the San Francisco 49ers and the Dallas Cowboys. He was the first Duke to be a first-team Division I-AA All-America and the first Duke chosen in the NFL draft (San Francisco, 1986, fourth round). He is JMU's career tackles leader.

**Foxx** played with the Miami Dolphins.

**Brooks** was with the Dallas Cowboys and Chicago Bears.

**Keaton** was with the Cincinnati Bengals and New Orleans Saints after being the 1999 Atlantic 10 offensive player of the year when he ran for 1,719 yards and 20 touchdowns.

**Perry** was a tight end and long snapper with the Miami Dolphins and Kansas City Chiefs after being Miami's sixth-round 1997 draft pick and first-team All-Yankee Football Conference during each of his final three collegiate seasons.

**Joyce** was a return specialist for the New York Giants and New York Jets. He ended his career at JMU as the only player in Division I-AA history with 1,000 yards in each of the career statistical categories of rushing, receiving, punt returns and kickoff returns and as the all-time Division I-AA leader in punt return yards and combined kick return yards. He holds many of JMU's career kick return marks and is the program's all-time leader in all-purpose yards with 5,659.

Two other former Dukes saw extensive time during the 2007 preseason with NFL teams, including tailback **Alvin Banks** (2003-06) with the New York Jets and offensive lineman **Corey Davis** (2003-06) with the Buffalo Bills. **Justin Rascati**, JMU's starting quarterback from 2004-06, briefly was with the Chicago Bears.

### JMU'S STADIUM EXPANSION

JMU at the end of the 2009 regular season will begin an expansion project that will bring seating at its on-campus Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field to approximately 25,000.

After the Dukes' Nov. 21 game, the stadium's west stands will be demolished and a rebuilding project started. The new stands will be higher and closer to the field with easier access and improved sight lines. The new section will keep the stadium's capacity about the same as during in 2009, approximately 15,500.

After the 2010 season, improvements to the west side will include a second deck, club and suite levels, a press box and enhanced lighting. The addition of permanent end zone seating also will be part of the project after the 2010 season.

Cost estimates for the stadium expansion project are \$62 million.

## MATTHEWS SETS WINS MARK

Mickey Matthews (1999-2008) became JMU's winningest football coach Sept. 27, 2008 in a 24-10 victory at Maine. The win gave the then-10th-year Dukes coach a 68-45 JMU record.

Challace McMillin (1972-84), JMU's first football coach, had a 67-56-1 record during 13 JMU seasons and held the program's previous coaching victories record. McMillin has retired as a JMU kinesiology teaching staff member, but he continues to work with JMU athletic teams in a sports psychology role. He was with the team at Maine for a special team presentation to Matthews in recognition the coach's accomplishment.

## JMU'S HOME SUCCESS

JMU's Nov. 15 home victory over William & Mary last season allowed the Dukes to match their best home regular-season record (6-0). The Dukes also had a 6-0 record at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field in 2000, and they were 5-0 at home during the 1975, 1978, 1987, 1999 and 2006 seasons.

The Dukes after the William & Mary game won twice at home in the NCAA playoffs before falling at home in the playoff semifinals. Overall they have won 10 of their last 13 home games, 21 of their last 25, 24 of their last 29, 29 of their last 35 since the beginning of their NCAA championship season of 2004, and 35 of their last 42.

JMU's unbeaten home years are among the top years in program history.

The 1975 team was 9-0-1 in the college division; the 1978 team was 8-2 and No. 9 in Division III; the 1987 team was 9-3 and JMU's first to reach post-season Division I-AA play; the 1999 team was 8-4 and went to the playoffs during Coach Mickey Matthews' first JMU year; the 2000 team was 6-5, and the 2006 team was 9-3 and an NCAA playoff invitee.

## JMU, MATTHEWS AT HOME

JMU has a 50-15 (.769) record at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field in 11 years (1999-2009) under Coach Mickey Matthews with eight of the losses during a two-year span (2001-02) when the Dukes had a combined overall record of 7-16 (JMU was 2-9 in 2001 and 5-7 in 2002).

## COACHING STAFF UPDATE

JMU's coaching staff returns nine of its 10 assistants from last season with safeties' coach Maurice "Mo" Linguist the group's only newcomer.

Linguist joined the JMU staff after 10-

year Dukes assistant George Barlow (safeties/defensive coordinator) accepted an assistant's position at New Mexico. Barlow had been a member of the JMU staff since soon after Mickey Matthews' hiring as JMU's head coach in 1999.

Kyle Gillenwater assumed JMU's defensive coordinator's duties and continues to coach the team's linebackers in his 11th JMU year.

Ulrick Edmonds (running backs) is in his seventh year. The former JMU defensive lineman (1997-2000) was an assistant in 2001 and rejoined the staff in 2004.

In their sixth JMU seasons are Jeff Durden (offensive coordinator, quarterbacks, assistant head coach) and J.C. Price (defensive line, defensive run game coordinator).

In their fourth years on the JMU staff are tight ends coach Josh Haymore, offensive line coach Chris Malone and wide receivers and kickers coach Clayton Matthews.

Defensive line assistant Isai Bradshaw is in his third JMU year. Bradshaw, Haymore, and Matthews are former JMU players, and Bradshaw (defensive end) and Haymore (long snapper) were members of JMU's 2004 national title team.

Cornerbacks/free safeties coach Mark Hendricks is in his second JMU year.

## RECENT JMU SUCCESS

JMU has a 54-20 record (.730) since the beginning of the 2004 season.

The Dukes were 13-2 and won the then-NCAA Division I-AA championship in 2004; they were 7-4 in 2005; they were 9-3 and NCAA post-season participants in 2006; they were 8-4 and NCAA participants in 2007; and they were 12-2 and Colonial Athletic Association champions and NCAA playoff semifinalists in 2008.

In league play, JMU is 33-11 (.750) since the start of 2004. The Dukes were 7-1 in the league play in 2004 and 2006, 5-3 in 2005, 6-2 in 2007 and 8-0 in 2008.

Four of JMU's losses during the last six years have been to FBS foes -- at West Virginia in 2004, at North Carolina to open 2007, at Duke to open 2008 and at Maryland to open 2009.

## CHALLENGING 2009 JMU SLATE

JMU's 2009 schedule includes a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent, three teams that played in last season Football Championship Subdivision playoffs and another foe that finished last season with a 10-2 record.

The schedule includes an opener at

Atlantic Coast Conference member Maryland. The Dukes meet playoff teams from a year ago in Richmond (Oct. 10), Villanova (Oct. 17) and Maine (Nov. 7), all at home. They play at Liberty, which was 10-2 last season, Sept. 26.

JMU's other home games are with Virginia Military Institute and Towson. Its other road contests are with Hofstra, William & Mary, and Delaware.

JMU during the 2008 regular season met FBS Duke and defeated four FCS playoff teams – Appalachian State, Maine, Richmond, and Villanova, all but Appalachian State on the road – and met three nationally ranked opponents while competing in the FCS playoffs.

His mother, the former Robyn Dunn, was a field hockey and lacrosse player for the Dukes, and his sister Nikki is a freshman scholarship player in JMU's women's basketball program.

#### JMU'S NATIONAL RANKINGS

Until the Oct. 19 polls JMU was ranked in all but three top-25 FCS polls by The Sports Network since early during its national title season of 2004.

The Dukes moved into the top-25 rankings Sept. 20, 2004 and won that year's NCAA Division I-AA national title. They since had been out of the top 25 for only three weeks during the 2005 season. They moved back into the poll for the final 2005 voting (25th) and hadn't been lower than 17th in a TSN poll since.

In 2008, JMU was voted No. 1 in the Sept. 22 FCS coaches' poll, the first time it had held the top spot in the coaches' or The Sports Network poll since early in the 2005 season (JMU's first regular-season appearance at the top). JMU assumed the No. 1 TSN poll position Sept. 29.

Coming off its 2004 national title season -- when the Dukes were voted to the No. 1 position in the final FCS polls -- JMU was the FCS' No. 1 team in the 2005 preseason polls and through the first week of the 2005 regular season.

#### RUSHING ADVANTAGE

JMU had a rushing edge in 11 of its 14 games during the 2008 season, including its last six contests. JMU out-rushed Maryland 268-123 in its 2009 opener but was out-rushed 178-145 by Virginia Military, 154-136 at Hofstra, 225-116 by Villanova and 258-150 at William & Mary. JMU had 301 yards on the ground to Liberty's 96, 126 to Richmond's 99, 124 to Delaware's nine, 195 to Maine's 49, and 212 to Massachusetts' 159.

Since the beginning of the 2006 season, JMU has had a rushing edge in 38 of 48 games. It's had a rushing edge in 48 of 59 games since the start of the 2005 season and in 60 of 74 games since the start of its 13-2 national title season in 2004.

#### JMU'S QB PROTECTION

JMU allowed only 11 quarterback sacks in 14 games in 2008 after allowing only six in 12 games in 2007. JMU didn't allow a sack at Maryland or at Delaware but gave up three vs. Hofstra, William & Mary and Maine, two vs. VMI, Liberty and Richmond, and one vs. Villanova and Massachusetts.

JMU in 2007 led the nation's FCS teams in fewest sacks allowed per game.

#### McGEE'S SCORING RETURNS

Senior cornerback/return specialist Scotty McGee (Virginia Beach, Va.) has returned six kicks for scores as a JMU player, just one off the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision national record for combined kick returns for scores.

McGee during his JMU career has scored on three kickoff returns (one during each of the 2006, 2007, and 2008 seasons) and on three punt returns (all during the 2008 season).

The FCS career mark for punt returns for scores is Northern Iowa's Kenny Shedd's seven (1989-92). The mark for career kickoff returns for scores is six by Hampton's Jerome Mathis (2001-04).

McGee has broken Gary Clark's (1980-83) team career record of four kick returns for touchdowns. Clark as a JMU player returned three punts and one kickoff for scores. He returned a punt for a touchdown at home against Appalachian State in 1982, two punts for touchdowns at Virginia in 1983 and a kickoff for a touchdown at home against Liberty in 1983.

Dwight Robinson (1991-94) had three kickoff returns for touchdowns as a JMU player – in 1993 against Lock Haven and William & Mary and in 1994 against Villanova.

**JMU'S RECENT TURNOVERS**

JMU during the 2008 season had only 16 turnovers (five interceptions, 11 lost fumbles) during a 12-2 year during which it reached the Football Championship Subdivision semifinals. Seven came during the team's opener at Duke (3) and its final game against Montana (4) in the NCAA playoff semifinals.

In 12 games during JMU's 8-4 NCAA playoff season in 2007 JMU had 20 turnovers (15 lost fumbles, five interceptions).

JMU didn't have a turnover at Maryland or against Virginia Military, but the Dukes lost a fumble and threw two interceptions at Liberty, threw an interception and lost a fumble at Hofstra, threw two interceptions and lost a fumble against Richmond, lost two fumbles against Villanova and William & Mary, lost two fumbles and threw an interception at Delaware, threw two interceptions against Maine, and lost a fumble at Massachusetts.

**MOATS ON BUCHANAN LIST**

JMU senior defensive end Arthur Moats (Portsmouth, Va.) is among 20 players nationally listed on the Buck Buchanan Award "Watch List."

The Buchanan Award recognizes the leading defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision and is presented by The Sports Network.

JMU linebacker Derrick Lloyd won the Buchanan Award in 2001, and Dukes' linebacker Akeem Jordan was runner-up for the award in 2006.

JMU quarterback Rodney Landers in 2008 was runner-up for The Sports Network's Walter Payton Award that is presented annually to the leading offensive player in the FCS.

**LANDERS JOINS INDOOR TEAM**

Former JMU quarterback Rodney Landers (2005-08) has signed to play with the Indoor Football League's Richmond (Va.) Revolution, the team announced Oct. 27.

Landers was JMU's starting quarterback during NCAA playoff seasons in 2007 and 2008. In 2008, he was runner-up for the Walter Payton Award as the top

offensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision while setting JMU season records for rushing yards (1,770) and yards of total offense (3,304). He ran for 16 touchdowns and threw for 1,534 yards and 21 touchdowns last season.

#### **YANCEY RETURNS TO OFFENSE**

Junior Griff Yancey (Glen Allen, Va.) ran 16 times for a team-leading 74 yards against Richmond Oct. 10 in his first action as an offensive player during the 2009 season.

Yancey during the 2007 and 2008 seasons ran for 1,183 yards as a tailback, but he moved to free safety late during the 2009 spring practice period. He started at free safety in three of JMU's first four 2009 games and missed the other with an injury.

He had 22 touchdowns (18 rushing, four receiving) during the 2007 and 2008 seasons.

#### **STAT NOTES VS. MARYLAND**

- JMU's 35 points are the most it's scored vs. a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent. The previous best was in a 24-20 win at Navy Oct. 28, 1989.
- JMU didn't have a turnover, its first game vs. an FBS team since Virginia Tech in 1991 (nine games) it went without a turnover.
- JMU had a 417-359 advantage in yards of total offense and a 268-123 edge in rushing yards.
- JMU's 417 yards of total offense are the most it's had in a game vs. an FBS opponent. Its 268 rushing yards are its second-best mark vs. an FBS team, trailing only the 334 it compiled in a 24-20 win at Navy in 1989.
- Junior quarterback Drew Dudzik (Clifton, Va.) had career highs for rushing attempts (14), rushing yards (112), passes (15), completions (9), touchdown passes (2), and yards of total offense (253). He had a career-long run of 70 yards.
- Sophomore safety Jon Williams' (Ridgeway, Va.) 62-yard interception return for a touchdown matched the eighth-longest interception return in team history and was JMU's first interception return for a score since Ronnell Brown's (Chesapeake, Va.) 44-yarder vs. Hofstra Oct. 4, 2008.
- Junior tailback Jamal Sullivan (Ruther Glen, Va.) had career highs of 19 rushing attempts and 87 rushing yards.
- Senior tight end Mike Caussin (Springfield, Va.) tied his career high of two receiving touchdowns.

#### **STAT NOTES VS. VMI**

- JMU's 341 passing yards were its most in a game since throwing for 376 yards Oct. 6, 2001 in a 45-44 overtime loss at Villanova.
- Senior wide receiver Rockeed McCarter's career-high 168 receiving yards were JMU's No. 9 all-time individual game figure and the most by a JMU player since Earnest Payton's (1997-2000) 181 receiving yards in a 72-0 home win over Lock Haven Sept. 2, 2000. McCarter had a career-high eight catches.
- JMU had two 100-yard receivers (Rockeed McCarter 168 yards, Mike Caussin career-high 145 yards) for the first time in a game since Sept. 12, 1998 in a 37-24 home loss to Hofstra. Neither previously had had a 100-yard receiving game.
- JMU had two receivers with two touchdown catches (Mike Caussin, Rockeed McCarter) for the first time in a game since Anthony Archer (1989-91) and David McLeod (1990-93) each had two in a 29-28 win at William & Mary Sept. 28, 1991.
- JMU threw four touchdown passes (three by Drew Dudzik, one by Justin Thorpe) for the first time in a game since Sept. 17, 2005 in a 65-7 home win over Delaware State.
- VMI had 178 rushing yards to JMU's 145, the first time JMU had been out-gained on the ground in eight games – since last season's 23-19 win at Villanova (Oct. 25).
- JMU didn't have a turnover for the second straight game.

#### **STAT NOTES VS. LIBERTY**

- Sophomore tailback Corwin Acker (Landover, Md.) had career highs of 12 rushes, 147 rushing yards and two rushing scores and a career-long run of 65 yards.
- Junior tailback Jamal Sullivan (Ruther Glen, Va.) ran for a career-high 93 yards.
- JMU limited Liberty to 217 yards of total offense and 96 rushing yards.
- JMU limited Liberty to nine first downs, the fewest by a JMU opponent since Richmond had nine Oct. 28, 2006 in a 27-10 JMU road victory. A JMU opponent last had fewer than nine first downs during a game when Delaware State had five in a 65-7 JMU home victory Sept. 17, 2005.
- Sophomore defensive end D.J. Bryant (Baltimore, Md.) and junior free safety Griff Yancey (Glen Allen, Va.) had their first career interceptions.
- JMU had its first turnovers of 2009, two interceptions and a lost fumble.
- Junior Matt Goff (Fairfax, Va.) had a

65-yard punt, the eighth-longest punt in team history and the longest since Jason Pritchard's (2005-08) 70-yarder Nov. 17, 2007 in a 23-12 home win over Towson.

#### **STAT NOTES VS. HOFSTRA**

- Redshirt freshman quarterback Justin Thorpe (Richmond, Va.) ran a career-high 18 times for a career-high 96 yards and had a career-long run of 37 yards for a touchdown.
- JMU's 192 yards of total offense were its fewest in a game since having 157 yards in a 10-7 loss on a rain-saturated field at Massachusetts Oct. 15, 2005. Other than the game at Massachusetts, the Dukes last had as few as 192 yards when they finished with 166 in a 20-13 home win over Delaware Nov. 6, 2004 during their NCAA championship season.
- Hofstra didn't have turnover and was penalized only once for 10 yards.
- Sophomore tailback Scott Noble (Baltimore, Md.) had his first rushing touchdown since the 2007 season (he was a 2008 redshirt).
- Senior defensive end Arthur Moats (Portsmouth, Va.) had a team-high-tying 10 tackles, including two quarterback sacks, and blocked a field goal attempt.
- JMU had four quarterback sacks.

#### **STAT NOTES VS. RICHMOND**

- Sophomore tailback/wide receiver Corwin Acker (Landover, Md.) scored on a 15-yard return of punt block by sophomore defensive end D.J. Bryant (Baltimore, Md.). The return for a touchdown was JMU's first score on a punt block since Acker scored off a block by wide receiver Rockeed McCarter (Philadelphia, Pa.) Oct. 4, 2008 in a 56-0 home win over Hofstra.
- Junior quarterback Drew Dudzik (Clifton, Va.) threw his sixth scoring pass of the year, a 38-yarder senior wide receiver Rockeed McCarter (Philadelphia, Pa.). The scoring catch was McCarter's third of the season and 12th of his career.
- Junior tailback Griff Yancey (Glen Allen, Va.) ran for a team-high 74 yards in his first action of the season on offense. Yancey made three starts at free safety during JMU's first four games and missed another game with an injury.
- Senior defensive end Arthur Moats (Portsmouth, Va.) had six unassisted tackles, four tackles for loss and a quarterback sack among nine total tackles.
- JMU limited Richmond to 99 rushing yards and 264 yards of total offense. Richmond compiled 132 first-quarter yards and 132 yards the rest of the way.

**STAT NOTES VS. VILLANOVA**

- Redshirt freshman quarterback Justin Thorpe (Richmond, Va.) had career-high figures of 144 passing yards, 209 yards of total offense, 13 completions, 32 pass attempts and 50 plays of total offense.

- Sophomore wide receiver/tailback Corwin Acker (Landover, Md.) had a career-high four receptions.

- JMU was shut out for the first time since 2003, for the first time by an FCS team since 2002 and for the first time at home since 1990.

- Senior cornerback Scotty McGee (Virginia Beach, Va.) broke Delvin Joyce's (1997-2000) JMU career record of 1,902 kickoff return yards.
- Redshirt freshman Chase Williams (Gaithersburg, Md.) had his first career interception and recovered a fumble. The turnovers were the first JMU had gotten in four games.
- Sophomore placekicker Dixon Wright (Crossnore, N.C.) kicked a career-long 44-yard field goal.
- True-freshman free safety Jakarie Jackson (Frederick, Md.) had career highs of 10 overall tackles and eight solo stops.
- William & Mary ran for 258 yards, the most rushing yards the Dukes have allowed since giving up 334 Oct. 22, 2005 in a 34-28 loss at Delaware.
- JMU didn't have an offensive touchdown for the second-straight game, the first time it had gone two-straight games without an offensive touchdown since not having one in three-straight games to close a 3-8 season in 1983.

- Redshirt freshman quarterback Justin Thorpe (Richmond, Va.) had career highs of 262 passing yards and 304 yards of total offense. He ran for one touchdown and threw for one and had pass completions of 53, 51, 31, 28 and 27 yards.
- Redshirt freshman linebacker Chase Williams (Gaithersburg, Md.) had a team- and career-high 11 tackles, including a team-season-best 10 solo stops.
- Senior defensive end Arthur Moats (Portsmouth, Va.) had 2.5 sacks, giving him at least one sack in seven straight games and at least a shared sack in his last 14 games and 18 of his last 19 games against FCS opponents.

- JMU intercepted four passes in a game for the first time since a 42-10 win at Hofstra Oct. 1, 2005.

- Sophomore placekicker Dixon Wright (Crossnore, N.C.) kicked two field goals in a game for the first time as a Duke.
- Redshirt freshman Justin Thorpe (Richmond, Va.) became JMU's all-time freshman quarterback rushing yards (533) and total offense (1,414) leader. He moved by Eriq Williams' (1989-92) rushing mark of 509 yards and Greg Maddox's (1996-98) total offense mark of 1,296 yards. Thorpe had a career-long 42-yard run for a touchdown.
- Sophomore tailback Scott Noble (Baltimore, Md.) had his first career touchdown reception, a 31-yarder from Justin Thorpe.
- Maine's 82-yard touchdown pass from Mike Busko to Troy Harris from punt formation matched the fourth-longest opponent pass play in JMU history and is the longest since Northeastern's Fred Vallett had a JMU-opponent-record-long 95-yard completion to Dave Klemic Nov. 7, 1998 (31-17 JMU win).

**STAT NOTES VS. UMASS**

- JMU won at Massachusetts for the first time since 1987, the season during which the teams first played in Amherst. The Minutemen now are 5-2-1 in series games on their field.
- Sophomore tailback Scott Noble (Baltimore, Md.) had career highs of 29 rushing attempts and 105 rushing yards. His previous career bests were nine attempts and 55 yards. Noble's 29 rushing attempts were the most in a game for a

JMU player since Rodney Landers (2005-08) ran 29 times at Appalachian State during the 2007 NCAA playoffs. Noble also caught three passes for 32 yards.

- Senior cornerbacks Scotty McGee (Virginia Beach, Va.) and Jamaris Sanders (Newport News, Va.) had the first fumble recoveries of their career. Sanders returned his recovery 38 yards for his first JMU touchdown.
- JMU limited the Minutemen to 247 yards after they entered the game averaging 383.1 yards per game.
- Massachusetts began four series inside its 20-yard line after punts by junior Matt Goff (Fairfax, Va.). The drives started at the one-, two-, 12- and 14-yard lines.
- Senior defensive end Arthur Moats (Chesapeake, Va.) had a team-leading 11 tackles, including four unassisted stops, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 quarterback sacks. He raised his season totals to 23.5 tackles for loss and 11 sacks.
- True freshman free safety Jakarie Jackson (Frederick, Md.) had his second interception of the season.

## Maryland 38, JMU 35, ot

Capital One Field At Byrd Stadium -- College Park, Md. -- Sept 12, 2009

Maryland freshman Nick Ferrara kicked a 26-yard field goal in overtime to lift the host Terrapins to the win. JMU rallied from a 21-6 deficit to take leads of 28-21 and 35-28 during the final half, but Maryland tied the score with just more than five minutes left in regulation. JMU then failed to move for a first down and missed on a long field goal try on its overtime possession before Ferrara's kick gave Maryland the win.

JMU gained only one yard during its overtime series before settling for a 41-yard field goal try. Maryland had runs of five, seven and six yards to reach the JMU seven during its overtime possession before taking a two-yard loss and kicking the game-winning field goal on third down.

JMU had a 417-359 advantage in yards of total offense, but the Dukes were penalized 11 times for 105 yards and gave up an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

Drew Dudzik led the JMU offense, throwing for 141 yards and two touchdowns and running for 122 yards and a score.

Maryland quarterback Chris Turner threw for 236 yards and a touchdown and ran for 28 yards and a score. Turner's 27-yard touchdown pass to Adrian Cannon with 5:09 left in the fourth quarter allowed Maryland to tie the score at 35-35.

After trailing 21-6, JMU got to within 21-14 on a four-yard touchdown run by Jamal Sullivan 2:06 before halftime and took advantage two Maryland turnovers to take a 28-21 lead late during the third quarter.

Corwin Acker's recovery of a Maryland fumble on a punt return set up a 45-yard scoring drive that allowed JMU to pull into a 21-21 tie, and Jon Williams' 62-yard interception return for a touchdown gave JMU a 28-21 lead with 1:38 left in the third quarter.

After Acker's recovery, the Dukes scored in six plays. A 28-yard pass from Dudzik to Charlie Newman got JMU to the Terrapin 14. Penalties for an illegal block and illegal procedure set the Dukes back, but Dudzik hit Scott Noble with a 15-yard pass and connected with Mike Caussin on a 15-yard touchdown pass with 3:05 left in the third period.

Williams' interception return that gave JMU its 28-21 lead came on the third play of Maryland's next possession. Williams stepped in front of the intended receiver as Turner rolled right and threw back to his left, and he sprinted along the sideline to score.

Maryland tied the score with 12:18 left in the fourth quarter when Torrey Smith scored on an eight-yard reverse at the end of a three-play, 39-yard drive. The Terps took possession after forcing JMU to punt from its nine.

JMU went back in front 35-28 on the following possession when Dudzik scored on a 70-yard run. He scored on the second play of the series, breaking outside on the left, racing along the sideline and cutting back inside just before reaching the end zone.

Cannon's game-tying touchdown came at the end of 78-yard, eight-play series.

Maryland scored first, driving 71 yards in 10 plays with Da'Rel Scott capping the series with a one-yard carry with 8:05 left in the opening quarter.

JMU got to within 7-6 with 1:30 left in the first period when Dudzik and Caussin connected on a 20-yard scoring pass.

Smith returned the ensuing kickoff 81 yards for a touchdown for a 14-6 Maryland lead, and Turner scored from three yards at the end of a 81-yard, 14-play series for a 21-6 Terp lead with 4:46 left in the half.

## JMU 44, Virginia Military Institute 16

Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field -- Harrisonburg, Va. -- Sept. 19, 2009

Rockeed McCarter had 168 yards receiving and caught two touchdown passes during the final 3:14 of the first half to give JMU control in the non-conference win.

JMU led only 17-10 when Justin Thorpe found McCarter on a 14-yard screen pass for a score with 3:14 left in the half. The Dukes then held Virginia Military on a fourth-and-one play from their 36 and drove 64 yards in eight plays to raise their lead to 21 points. VMI's drive started at the JMU 45 after a penalty on the Dukes during the kickoff return.

McCarter scored on a 23-yard pass from Drew Dudzik with six seconds left in the half after the duo combined on pass plays of 13 and 19 yards earlier during the possession.

McCarter finished with eight catches and surpassed his previous career highs of four receptions and 87 receiving yards. He had JMU's first 150-yard game by a receiver since Alan Harrison had 150 yards against Villanova on Oct. 6, 2001 and the program's No. 9 all-time game receiving yards mark.

Mike Caussin nearly gave the Dukes two 150-yard receivers, finishing with three catches for a career-high 145 yards and a pair of scores (65 and 26 yards). It was his second straight week with two scores and third of his career.

JMU last had had two 100-yard receivers in a game Sept. 12, 1998 when Lindsay Fleshman had 114 receiving yards and Earnest Payton 104 in a 37-24 home loss to Hofstra.

JMU rotated quarterbacks on each series. Dudzik completed nine of 13 passes for 214 yards and three touchdowns, and Thorpe hit on seven of 11 passes for 127 yards and a score and ran for 53 yards and another touchdown.

The Dukes finished with 486 total yards of offense (8.0 per play), including 341 passing, its best game passing effort since throwing for 376 yards at Villanova in 2001.

Thorpe led the Dukes on a nine-play, 78-yard drive, culminating in a one-yard scoring plunge by Jamal Sullivan, on their first series.

The teams traded possessions until VMI pinned JMU deep in its territory and took possession on the Dukes' 40. Nine plays later Jeff Sexton kicked a 32-yard field goal to make the score 7-3 early in the second quarter.

Dixon Wright kicked his first career field goal – a 37-yarder – for a 10-3 JMU lead after Scotty McGee returned the ensuing kickoff 64 yards, and Caussin's 65-yard scoring catch from Dudzik gave JMU a 17-3 lead less than three minutes later.

VMI got to within 17-10 on a four-yard run by Michael Rainey-Wiles with 6:08 left in the half after Kyle Hughes hit Bryan Barnson on a 67-yard pass to the JMU three.

## JMU 24, Liberty 10

Williams Stadium -- Lynchburg, Va. -- Sept. 26, 2009

Corwin Acker ran for a career-high 147 yards and two second-half touchdowns to lead JMU to the non-conference victory. Acker scored on a 65-yard run to break a 10-10 tie early during the final quarter and later had a 13-yard scoring carry to all but seal the victory for the Dukes.

Acker's career-long 65-yard carry came on the first play from scrimmage after Liberty pulled into a 10-10 tie on Matt Blevins' 27-yard field goal with 14:55 remaining. Acker got to the outside to his left and raced along the sideline to score at the 14:35 mark of the final period.

His 13-yard touchdown run came with 1:58 to play on the first snap after JMU's Griff Yancey returned an interception 34 yards.

Acker ran 12 times overall and late during the game was playing in place of Jamal Sullivan, who didn't return to play after suffering an apparent lower leg injury during the third quarter. Sullivan ran 15 times for a career-high 93 yards and JMU's first touchdown, and he and Acker led a 301-yard rushing attack for the Dukes.

JMU finished with 348 yards of total offense during a game that was played in a steady rain. Liberty had 217 yards (96 rushing, 121 passing). The Flames compiled only 88 yards of total offense during the second half.

Blevins' game-tying field goal came after Liberty recovered a JMU fumble at the Dukes' 43-yard line, JMU's third turnover in less than 10 minutes of clock time midway through the contest. The Flames reached the JMU 10 in nine plays.

The Dukes returned the ensuing kickoff to their 35 to set up Acker's first touchdown.

Liberty reached the JMU 34 on the following possession and then pinned JMU at its five-yard line with a punt. The Dukes failed to move for a first down but got a 65-yard punt from Matt Goff to push the Flames back to their 29. The punt was the eighth-longest punt in team history.

The teams then traded punts before Yancey's interception return set up JMU's clinching touchdown.

JMU scored first, getting a 35-yard field goal from Dixon Wright on its first possession after forcing a Liberty punt. The Liberty kick went to the JMU two-yard line, and the Dukes drove 80 yards in 12 plays to score with 5:22 left in the opening quarter. JMU compiled six first downs and got four rushing attempts for 41 yards from Sullivan while reaching the Liberty 18.

Liberty went in front 7-3 on the next series, moving 80 yards in 10 plays with Tommy Beecher scoring from the one on a second-down play on the opening snap of the second period. Beecher set up the score with two long third-down passes. He hit B.J. Hayes with a 26-yard pass to the JMU 34 on a third-and-10 play and Chris Summers on a 43-yard completion to the JMU one on a third-and-20.

JMU took a 10-7 lead with 5:14 left in the first half when Sullivan scored from five yards to cap a 46-yard, five-play possession. Drew Dudzik hit Mike Caussin on a 16-yard pass to start the drive, and Sullivan had carries of nine and 17 yards before his scoring run.

A five-yard interception return of a deflected Liberty pass by D.J. Bryant gave JMU the ball at the Liberty 41 with 2:53 left in the half, but the Dukes squandered the scoring chance by throwing an interception from the Liberty nine.

JMU, which didn't have a turnover during its first two games, threw another interception and lost a fumble during the third quarter.

## Hofstra 24, JMU 17

Shuart Stadium -- Hempstead, N.Y. -- Oct. 3, 2009

Cory Christopher threw for one touchdown and ran for another, and Dave Wilson caught two touchdown passes to lead Hofstra. The host Pride led 21-10 at halftime and limited JMU to 192 yards of total offense in a game that was delayed because of lightning for 47 minutes with 1:23 left in the first half.

Christopher scored on a 17-yard run to give Hofstra a 7-0 first-quarter lead and hit Wilson on a four-yard touchdown pass five seconds before halftime for the Pride's 21-10 advantage at the break. Wilson's other score came on a 34-yard pass from Steve Probst for a 14-3 Hofstra lead early during the second quarter.

The Pride, after leading by 11 points at halftime, didn't score again until Henry Greco kicked a 42-yard field goal with 2:14 left in the game, but JMU managed only one second-half score.

The Dukes compiled only 77 yards of total offense during the final half but still had a final possession with a chance to at least tie the game. They started from their 28 after Greco's field goal and advanced to the Hofstra 24 when Rockeed McCarter pulled in a 35-yard pass from Justin Thorpe with just more than a minute left on the clock.

However, on first down from the 24, JMU lost 20 yards on a bad snap from center, threw an incompleteness on second down and had an offensive pass interference penalty nullify what would have been a 27-yard completion to the Pride 17 from Drew Dudzik to McCarter.

The Dukes got a 22-yard completion from Dudzik to McCarter on third down (recovering their own fumble on a hook-and-lateral play) but then threw an incompleteness on fourth down.

Hofstra finished with 287 yards of total offense (154 rushing, 133 passing) while JMU ran for 136 yards and threw for 56.

Hofstra had 17 first downs to JMU's 11, didn't have a turnover and was penalized only once for 10 yards. JMU threw an interception, lost a fumble and was penalized twice for 20 yards.

The Pride was successful on four of five fourth-down conversion attempts.

Hofstra took a 7-0 lead on its second series, driving 79 yards in 10 plays with Christopher running the final 17 yards for the touchdown. Christopher scrambled nine yards for a first down on a third-and-seven from the Hofstra 24, and the Pride got a 22-yard carry from Everette Benjamin on fourth-and one from its 42.

JMU cut the lead to 7-3 on the following series when Dixon Wright kicked a 23-yard field goal. Scotty McGee returned the kickoff 54 yards to the Hofstra 33, and the Dukes got two first downs and advanced as far as the Hofstra four before being stopped.

Hofstra raised the lead to 14-3, scoring on Probst's 34-yard pass to Wilson with 10:34 left in the second quarter. The Pride scored in three plays after taking possession at the JMU 48 following a punt.

JMU pulled to within 14-10 two plays later when Thorpe scored on a 37-yard run. JMU got a 30-yard kickoff return from Scott Noble to the Hofstra 45, and Noble ran for eight yards on the play before Thorpe scored.

Hofstra increased its lead to 21-10 on the weather-delayed possession. The Pride recovered a JMU fumble at the JMU 34 and used 15 plays to move 66 yards with Christopher capping the series with his four-yard touchdown pass to Wilson.

JMU got to within 21-17 on the initial series of the second half, driving 57 yards in 12 plays with Noble scoring from the one with 7:09 left in the third quarter. Thorpe ran five times for 49 yards during the drive, including a 29-yard scramble on third-and 12 from the JMU 41.

JMU didn't move for a first down on any of its following three possessions until getting the ball for the final time with just more than two minutes to play.

Richmond drove for the go-ahead score midway through the final quarter and forced a fumble as JMU was driving with one minute to play to pull out the win.

JMU led 17-14 at the half and remained in front until the fourth quarter. The Spiders took possession at their 24 with 13:06 remaining after an interception. Richmond drove 76 yards in 10 plays, culminating in a six-yard touchdown pass from Eric Ward to Ben Keating, who scored all three touchdowns for the Spiders.

The Dukes responded with a lengthy drive of their own. JMU rushed 10 consecutive times, including a fourth-and-one conversion, to reach the Richmond 27. The only pass of the drive from Justin Thorpe to Julius Graves moved the ball to the six. However, with Thorpe scrambling in the backfield looking for a receiver, Martin Parker forced a fumble for the Spiders, and Eric McBride recovered to seal the Richmond victory.

Thorpe started at quarterback for the Dukes and completed seven of 15 passes for 87 yards and rushed 14 times for 42 yards. He also accounted for all three turnovers in the game with two interceptions and the late fumble.

Drew Dudzik led JMU's lone touchdown drive and threw a 38-yard pass to Rockeed McCarter with 5:45 remaining in the second quarter. Dudzik, who completed three of six passes for 68 yards, was later forced from the contest due to an injury.

JMU finished with 281 total yards on 59 plays with 126 on the ground and 155 through the air. Richmond totaled 264 yards on 64 plays with 165 passing and 99 rushing.

Griff Yancey was the leading rusher for the Dukes with 74 yards on 16 carries.

Ward completed 16 of 26 passes for 165 yards for Richmond.

Keating rushed twice for two yards for the game, both carries resulting in one-yard touchdown plunges. Justin Forte rushed 18 times for 94 yards for the Spiders.

Richmond grabbed the lead just three minutes into the contest as Keating capped a 61-yard drive with his first one-yard rush.

The Dukes responded with a 42-yard field goal by Dixon Wright on a 10-play, 56-yard drive.

The Spiders claimed their largest lead, 14-3, as Keating capped another drive late in the first quarter. Richmond had a short field after stopping JMU deep in its own territory and returning a punt to the JMU 35-yard line. Richmond scored three plays later.

The teams traded possessions with the Dukes' defense stopping Richmond twice on short fields at the 50 and JMU 49.

That set the stage for Dudzik's drive and touchdown pass to McCarter for the 14-10 score on a 75-yard drive.

With momentum on JMU's side, the Dukes then stopped Richmond's drive at its own 28. On the punt attempt, D.J. Bryant blocked the attempt by Brett Weigand and Corwin Acker snagged the ball in the air and returned it 15 yards for the go-ahead score.

The third quarter was a defensive battle and exchange of field position. The teams combined for just six first downs and 134 total yards during the period.

## Villanova 27, JMU 0

Chris Whitney tied his career high of three touchdown passes and ran for 97 yards to lead Villanova in JMU's Homecoming game. Whitney completed 11 of his 16 passes for 93 yards. He also rushed 18 times as the Wildcats topped 200 yards rushing (225) for the third time this season.

Matt Szczur caught two of Whitney's scoring tosses and finished with four catches for 53 yards. He also ran eight times for 76 yards, mostly in direct-snap situations.

Villanova outgained JMU 318 to 260 yards, including 225 to 116 on the ground. The Wildcats led in possession time 33:38 to 26:22.

Villanova led 20-0 at halftime, including three scoring drives in the second quarter. The Wildcats scored after two JMU fumbles during the quarter, taking advantage of a short field. Whitney and Szczur connected on the first of their scoring plays, a 30-yard completion, to cap a 47-yard drive. Nick Yako then kicked a 32-yard field goal for the 20-0 score.

Villanova scored on a 67-yard drive on the game's first possession, culminating in a four-yard scoring strike from Whitney to Tony Canci. The Wildcats added a career-long 42-yard field goal by Yako early during in the second quarter.

The teams traded drives in the third quarter before Villanova completed a 53-yard series with the second Whitney-to-Szczur scoring connection of the day, a 22-yard strike. The points were the first JMU allowed in the third quarter in 2009.

The Dukes' best scoring opportunity came late during the second quarter. JMU drove 51 yards to the Villanova 22 before Dixon Wright missed on a 39-yard field goal attempt with three seconds remaining.

Justin Thorpe completed 13 of 32 passes for 144 yards and ran 18 times for 65 yards for JMU.

Corwin Acker caught four passes for 50 yards and Rockeed McCarter three for 49 yards for the Dukes.

## William & Mary 24, JMU 3

Zable Stadium -- Williamsburg, Va. -- Oct. 24, 2009

Jonathan Grimes ran for a career-high 158 yards, and R.J. Archer threw for two touchdowns to lead William & Mary to a homecoming win. Grimes, who ran 20 times, set up the Tribe's first touchdown with a season-long 61-yard run and scored on a nine-yard run in the final quarter. Archer had scoring passes of nine and 18 yards and completed 15 of 22 passes for 127 yards.

Both teams ran 67 plays, but William & Mary compiled 385 yards of total offense to JMU's 216 yards. The Tribe averaged 5.7 yards per offensive play to JMU's 3.2 yards and converted on eight of 14 third-down situations.

William & Mary led 7-0 after one quarter, 10-3 at halftime and 17-3 after three quarters.

William & Mary scored first, moving 69 yards in three plays with Archer hitting tight end Rob Varno on a nine-yard touchdown pass with 3:26 left in the opening quarter. Grimes' 61-yard run to the JMU eight started the series.

JMU pulled to within 7-3 on the following possession, getting a career-long 44-yard field goal from Dixon Wright with 13:48 left in the second quarter. The Dukes moved 40 yards in nine plays with Justin Thorpe carrying for 15 and 18 yards on a pair of option runs.

William & Mary raised its lead to 10-3 on a 34-yard Brain Pate field goal as time expired in the second quarter. The Tribe moved from its 13 after receiving a punt with 1:26 left on the clock. Grimes had a 12-yard run, and Archer scrambled 19 yards to the JMU 32. A pass interference penalty on JMU on the next snap moved the ball to the 17 with six seconds remaining, and Pate followed with the field goal.

The Tribe increased the margin to 17-3 on its second series of the final half, moving 80 yards in 14 plays and using 6:34 of clock time. Archer capped the drive with an 18-yard touchdown pass to tight end Alex Gottlieb with 3:41 left in the third period. William & Mary converted on four consecutive third-down situations, and Archer hit on three of four passes for 36 yards during the drive.

William & Mary got the game's final points with 5:45 to play on a nine-yard Grimes run. The Tribe drove 59 yards in eight plays after recovering a JMU fumble.

JMU reached the William & Mary 32 on its series after its second-quarter field goal but lost 22 yards and possession of the ball on a bad snap from center on a third-down-and-three play.

The Dukes penetrated Tribe territory three times during the second half. They punted after reaching the 41 early during the final quarter; their fumble on their next series after getting to the 45 set up William & Mary's final score; and they reached the 17 on their final possession but were stopped on a fourth-and-14 play from the 21.

Thorpe ran 15 times for 76 yards and completed seven of 17 passes for 66 yards for the Dukes. Jamal Sullivan carried 19 times for 67 yards.

Jakarie Jackson had a team-leading 10 tackles, including eight solo stops, for the JMU defense. Pat Williams and Arthur Moats each took part in nine stops. Moats, the nation's leader in tackles for loss, was credited with 2.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage, including a quarterback sack.

Moats' quarterback sack was the 25th of his career, tying him for third place on JMU's career sacks list. The program's all-time sacks leader is Chris Morant (1998-2000) with 33. Woody Bergeria (1975-77) is second on the list with 28 sacks, and Larry Smith (1975-78) also had 25 career sacks.

## JMU 20, Delaware 8

Raymond Field/Delaware Stadium -- Newark, Del. -- Oct. 31, 2009

Justin Thorpe ran for one touchdown and threw for another to lead JMU to the win in Delaware's homecoming game. Thorpe ran 12 yards for JMU's first touchdown and hit Charlie Newman on a seven-yard scoring play for the Dukes' second touchdown. The conference offensive player of the week threw for 262 yards overall, and JMU compiled 386 yards of total offense in winning at Delaware for the first time since 1994.

JMU trailed 3-0 at halftime but scored on three of its first four possessions of the final half. The Dukes drove 75 yards on their first series of the third quarter to go up 7-3, went 66 yards on their third series of the half to lead 13-6 and drove 83 yards for a third score.

JMU during the second half compiled 287 yards of total offense, including 229 passing. The Dukes limited Delaware to 107 yards after halftime and to 224 yards overall after the Blue Hens entered the game averaging 30.9 points, 364.9 yards of total offense and 125.4 rushing yards per game.

JMU used six plays in grabbing the lead during the initial possession of the final half. Thorpe hit Mike Caussin on a 27-yard pass to start the series and Scott Noble on a 31-yard completion to the Delaware 15 to set up his 12-yard scoring run on an option to the right side.

Delaware pulled to within 7-6 on the following series, and JMU turned the ball over on its next possession before controlling the final quarter and a half.

The Dukes were in position to extend their lead on their second series of the half when Thorpe hit Rockeed McCarter on a 51-yard pass play from the JMU 39. However, a Delaware defender knocked the ball away as McCarter headed toward the end zone with the Blue Hens returning it to their 43.

Delaware got only one first down after the turnover, failing to convert on a fourth-and-two play from the JMU 34 with 5:06 left in the third period, and JMU quickly moved for its second score.

The Dukes used only five plays while navigating the 66 yards with Newman's scoring catch coming with 3:18 left in the third quarter. A 53-yard Thorpe-to-McCarter completion to the Delaware 11 set up the touchdown.

JMU held Delaware without a first down on the ensuing series and used 14 plays to move for its third touchdown. Thorpe completed four straight passes for 50 yards and had an 11-yard run before Jamal Sullivan scored from the three to give JMU a 20-6 lead with 9:57 left in the game.

Delaware came back three series later to reach the JMU nine but suffered a second-down sack before the Dukes' Jakarie Jackson intercepted a fourth-down pass from the 19.

Delaware took its 3-0 lead with 13:14 left in the second quarter on a 34-yard Jon Striesky field goal. The Blue Hens moved 67 yards in 11 plays from their 22 with Pat Devlin completing four of five passes for 57 yards during the series.

Devlin hit on 19 of 42 passes for 215 yards but was intercepted twice and sacked eight times. The Hens didn't have a running play by a running back of more than 10 yards.

Four Dukes had sacks, including Arthur Moats, who was credited with 2.5 among his seven tackles. Moats entered the game as the national leader in tackles for loss, and his sacks raised his season total to 9.5 and his career mark to 27.5.

Chase Williams, the league rookie of the week, had a team-high 11 tackles, including 10 unassisted and 1.5 sacks, for the JMU defense. Sam Daniels had two sacks and five tackles overall and D.J. Bryant a sack.

## JMU 22, Maine 14

**Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field -- Harrisonburg, Va. -- Nov. 7, 2009**

Justin Thorpe ran for one touchdown and threw for another as JMU took a 22-0 lead after three quarters and benefitted from six Maine turnovers. Thorpe, the CAA rookie of the week, had 216 yards of total offense. He completed nine of 13 passes for 133 yards and ran 17 times for a net of 83 yards.

Jamal Sullivan rushed 22 times for 83 yards as the pair accounted for 299 total yards. The Dukes led in total offense 328-309 and forced four interceptions and two fumbles by the Black Bears. JMU held Maine to 49 total yards rushing with a 195-49 advantage on the ground for the game.

The Dukes took advantage of a series of first-half mistakes by the Black Bears to build a 15-0 lead at the break. JMU opened the game's scoring on a safety in the second quarter when the snap on a Maine punt attempt went through the end zone.

The ensuing free kick went out of bounds to set up JMU at the 50, and Thorpe had a career-long 42-yard burst to put the Dukes in front 9-0. A pair of Dixon Wright field goals, set up by short fields after an interception and a fumble, gave JMU the 15-0 lead at the half.

JMU received the kick to open the second half and drove 66 yards on nine plays in five minutes, culminating in a 31-yard pass from Thorpe to Scott Noble for a 22-0 lead.

Maine made the game close in the fourth quarter with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Warren Smith to Mike Brusko and an 82-yard scoring pass out of punt formation from Brusko to Troy Harris to get to within 22-14 with 6:01 remaining.

JMU went without a first down on series twice in the final six minutes, but the Dukes held the Black Bears to a total of 24 yards on their final two possessions before intercepting a pass on the game's final play.

Maine opened the game with a 14-play, 80-yard drive in 7:50 to the JMU eight, but the Dukes on fourth and one stopped tailback Derek Session for a one-yard loss.

Pat Williams led JMU with 11 total tackles. The Dukes got interceptions from Ronnell Brown, Leavander Jones, Vidal Nelson and Chase Williams.

## JMU 17, Massachusetts 14

McGuirk Alumni Stadium -- Amherst, Mass. -- Nov. 14, 2009

Scott Noble ran for a career-high 105 yards, and JMU's defense scored a touchdown and set up a field goal as the Dukes won their third-straight game.

Noble started for the first time in 2009 and ran 29 times from scrimmage and caught three passes for 32 yards. He hadn't rushed more than nine times in a game previously at JMU, and his carries were the most in a game for a JMU player since Rodney Landers ran 29 times at Appalachian State during the 2007 NCAA playoffs.

JMU got the game's first points -- a field goal after recovering a fumble at the Massachusetts six -- and got a 38-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Jamaris Sanders. The Dukes' other points came on a 21-yard touchdown run by Justin Thorpe. Thorpe ran 20 times for 89 yards and completed eight of 13 passes for 120 yards.

JMU compiled 332 total yards and Massachusetts 247. The Minutemen entered the game averaging 383.1 yards, the second-best mark in the Colonial Athletic Association.

The Dukes scored all of their points during the first half and led 17-7 at halftime. They gave up a 77-yard touchdown drive on Massachusetts' second series of the final half but allowed the Minutemen only one first down on their final four possessions. Massachusetts had a net of only 23 yards of total offense on its final four series.

The Minutemen started a series at the JMU 46 with 5:49 left in the game after receiving a punt but gained only seven yards. They took possession at their 28 with 1:20 left following another punt and got a 16-yard completion on their first play but advanced only as far as their 47 before being stopped on downs with 0:11 remaining.

JMU took a 3-0 lead after recovering a fumble at the Massachusetts six on the Minutemen's first offensive play. Dixon Wright kicked a 20-yard field goal with 7:00 left in the opening quarter after JMU gained but three yards on three running plays. Scotty McGee recovered the fumble that was forced by Jon Williams.

JMU increased its lead to 10-0 three series later when Sanders stripped the ball from Massachusetts running back Tony Nelson and returned the turnover for a touchdown with 1:59 left in the first quarter.

Massachusetts got a 48-yard return of the ensuing kickoff to the JMU 39 and quickly pulled to within 10-7. Jon Hernandez capped the five-play scoring drive with a 16-yard touchdown run on the opening play of the second quarter.

JMU reached the Massachusetts nine during a nine-play series on the following possession but didn't convert on a 26-yard field goal attempt.

The Dukes did score on their next series, driving 57 yards in seven plays after a Massachusetts punt. Corwin Acker had a 16-yard carry on the series' second play and Thorpe an 11-yard scramble to the Minutemen 26 on a third-down-and-six play before Thorpe scored from the 21 for a 17-7 JMU lead with 4:03 left in the first half.

Massachusetts pulled within 17-14 on its second series of the final half, driving 77 yards in 12 plays and scoring on Nelson's six-yard run. Nelson had a 13-yard carry early during the possession and ran for 23 yards on the play before he scored.

The win was JMU's first at Massachusetts since 1987, the teams' first meeting in Amherst. The teams tied in a 1989 game at Massachusetts, and the Minutemen had won the last five meetings on their field.
