♦ **Kenny Brooks**, JMU '92 8th JMU and career year, 163-76 (.682)
 ♦ Joined the women's coaching staff in 2002-03 ♦ assistant coach in the Dukes' men's program 1998-2002 ♦ former point guard for the Dukes' men's team ♦ 2007 CAA Coach of the Year and Virginia Coach of the Year ♦ **150th** career win 11/29 at Western Carolina ♦ second-winningest coach in school history behind JMU Hall of Fame inductee Shelia Moorman (302-134 in 15 seasons, 1982-97) ♦ his **last four teams** have averaged **just under 25 wins** per season (24.75) and went to **postseason play** (3 WNIT, 1 NCAA)

Of Note

♦ JMU is coming off its **third CAA championship game appearance** in the last four years. The 2009 CAA final marked the Dukes' 12th title game appearance, which ranks second all-time behind ODU's 17. No other current CAA member has played in more than three CAA championship games.

♦ Associate head coach **Jackie Smith Carson** had her No. 22 **Furman jersey retired** in a ceremony at halftime of Furman's Nov. 19 game vs. Indiana State. She was a three-time All-Southern Conference pick and two-time Southern Conference Player of the Year selection at Furman in 1988 and 1989. She finished her career as the second all-time leading scorer in Furman history with 1,920 points.

JMU's leading scorer in all but two games has been a **guard**.

Dawn Evans has been the leading scorer in 17 games.

Tarik Hislop was the top scorer in two games (Liberty, Siena).

Player of the Year Candidate Dawn Evans

♦ **Dawn Evans** is among 28 players on the watch list for the **State Farm Wade Trophy** honoring the national player of the year. Evans was among seven players added to the original 21-player preseason list on Jan. 28.

Criteria for the award includes game and season statistics, leadership, character, effect on her team and overall playing ability. The selection of the additions was based on each player's successful on-court performance this season.

The Wade Trophy, named after the late, legendary three-time national champion Delta State head coach Margaret Wade, debuted in 1978 as the first-ever women's national player of the year award in college basketball.

♦ The midseason list for the **Wooden Award** honoring the top player in the country was announced Jan. 13, and it included **Dawn Evans** among its 21 players. Criteria to be selected to the list includes individual excellence and team record during the first half of the season.

♦ The early-season watch list for the **Naimith Trophy** honoring the top player in the country was announced Nov. 18, and it included **Dawn Evans** among its 50 players. Criteria to be selected to the watch list includes player performances from the previous year and expectations for the upcoming season. Evans was also on the watch list last season.

JMU has a tie to coach **Margaret Wade**, for whom the Wade Trophy is named.

Wade's Delta State team won the first of its three

consecutive AIAW national championships in **JMU's Godwin Hall**.

Delta State beat three-time defending national champion Immaculata 90-81 in the title game of the 16-team tournament on March 22, 1975.

♦ *Sports Illustrated* magazine's Nov. 23 issue included Dawn Evans among the 15 players on its preseason All-America team. She was selected to the third team.

♦ **Evans 101: Dawn Evans** scored 30 or more points in three consecutive outings in December, and that stretch of consecutive 30-point games was a first for a JMU player. She scored 101 points in 101 minutes in that span, which included 38 at Virginia 12/6, 31 at Duke 12/13 and 32 vs. Longwood 12/21.

Two other Dukes have scored 30 points in two consecutive games: Sue Manelski scored 33 in two games in a tournament at Southern Connecticut in December 1981; Tamera Young scored 38 and 33 in consecutive games against Radford and Indiana in the WNIT in March 2008.

♦ **They Voted for Dawn:** Dawn Evans was the runaway top choice in the Dec. 9 weekly poll on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association website. The poll, titled "Who do you want to take a last-second shot", was part of the weekly "Shootaround with Beth and Debbie" podcast featuring broadcasters Beth Mowins and Debbie Antonelli. Evans captured 83.9 percent of the vote, leading 2009 national Player of the Year Maya Moore of Connecticut (12.5%), Danielle Robinson of Oklahoma (1.5%), Monica Wright of Virginia (1.3%) and Alison Hightower of Louisiana State (0.6%).

♦ **Evans Sidelined Briefly in December:** Dawn Evans did not play Dec. 13 vs. Siena but returned to the starting lineup Dec. 18 at Duke.

Evans was sidelined after she underwent extensive testing on Dec. 8 at the University of Virginia Medical Center to address a kidney disorder. Due to the nature of the testing, she was prohibited from any physical contact until Dec. 16.

Evans was diagnosed with *focal segmental glomerulosclerosis* (FSGS), a disease that attacks the kidney's filtering system. The condition does not affect her playing status.

♦ What They're Saying About Dawn Evans:

"She is, by far, the most talented guard that I have, in my playing days and coaching days, seen out on the court. It doesn't matter if she's an undersized guard; she understands how to get the shot off no matter who is guarding her." -- Drexel coach **Denise Dillon**

"Dawn Evans is just too much for everybody to deal with." -- Virginia coach **Debbie Ryan**, after Evans scored a John Paul Jones Arena-record 38 points in JMU's Dec. 6 win over the Cavaliers.

"I guess it's like Kobe and LeBron, going back and forth. She played well. You know, you can't stop her." -- Towson's **Shanae Baker-Brice** after JMU's 72-68 overtime win at Towson on Jan. 14. Baker-Brice scored 32 points to Evans' 30.

"Usually you kind of know that this player penetrates better than she shoots or she shoots better than she penetrates. Well, she did everything." -- Duke junior guard **Jasmine Thomas** after Evans' 31-point performance in JMU's Dec. 18 loss to the Blue Devils.

"If she goes to get a drink of water, you have to go with her." -- Duke coach **Joanne P. McCallie** on how to defend Evans.

GAME 21: JMU 71, Virginia Commonwealth 56

RICHMOND, Va., Feb. 4, 2010 -- JMU (7-3, 17-4) pulled away midway through the first half and went on to post a 71-56 win over CAA-leading Virginia Commonwealth (8-2, 15-6) at the Siegel Center.

The Dukes' **Kiara Francisco** came off the bench to lead JMU with career highs of 16 points and 11 rebounds. She connected on five of nine field-goal tries and was six-for-eight at the foul line.

Tarik Hislop added 15 points and **Sarah Williams** scored 10.

VCU was led by **Kita Waller** with a game-high 14 points and eight rebounds. **D'Andra Moss** scored 14, and Courtney Hurt had a team-high nine rebounds.

The JMU defense limited VCU to its worst-shooting night of the year as the Rams hit only 26.5 percent (18-68) from the field.

In the opening half VCU scored seven unanswered points to break a 9-9 tie and go ahead 16-12 at the 10:07 mark. Moss, who scored eight of the Rams' first 16 points, had four points during the run.

JMU, however, scored the game's next 11 points to build a 23-16 lead with 7:10 on the clock. Five players tallied points, led by three points from Dawn Evans. Courtney Hamner's steal and ensuing layup finished off the run.

VCU got as close as three points twice before intermission, but the Dukes took a 32-24 lead into the locker room at halftime.

After the teams exchanged baskets to open the second half, JMU scored nine points in a row to push its lead to 43-26 on a three-pointer by Williams at 15:44. The Rams got no closer than 14 (the last time 50-36 at 10:36) the rest of the game.

Evans, who entered the game as the nation's second leading scorer (25.7 avg.), left the game at the 8:47 mark of the first half with an ankle injury. She scored only five points in the game as her school-record streak of 52 games scoring in double-figures ended.

2008-09, GAME 16: JMU 60, Drexel 56

HARRISONBURG, Va., Jan. 18, 2009 -- **Dawn Evans** scored JMU's last 22 points and finished with a game-high 30 points as the Dukes (4-1, 11-5) edged Drexel (3-2, 8-8) 60-56 in CAA play at the JMU Convocation Center.

JMU won for the eighth time in its last nine games.

Evans, the nation's leading scorer, netted her team's final 22 points in the last 10:22. During that span she hit two three-pointers, a jumper from just inside the three-point line, a 15-foot jumper and a layup. She also knocked down 10 of 12 free-throw attempts and was six for eight from the foul line in the final 17.6 seconds.

In a battle of two of the nation's leading scorers, **Gabriela Marginean** led the Dragons with 25 points. Marginean entered the game ranked fourth in the NCAA in scoring at 22.8 points per game.

Drexel took its first lead of the game on a baseline jumper by **Brooke Cornish** that put the Dragons up 36-35 at 12:48. Over the next nine and a half minutes there were two ties and five lead changes, with neither team ahead by more than three points.

The final four minutes had the fans on the edges of their seats.

Drexel took a 49-48 lead on a three-pointer by **Marisa Crane** at 3:37, then JMU went back on top 50-49 on two Evans free throws with 3:21 left. After Crane missed a three-pointer at 2:59, JMU got the rebound and missed three shots, but got the offensive rebound each time. Then Evans was fouled with 1:58 left, Drexel's seventh team foul, and hit both ends of the 1+1 for a 52-49 JMU lead.

Drexel cut the margin to 52-51 on two Marginean foul shots at 1:12, then Evans drove for a layup at 1:01 to give JMU a 54-51 lead.

Drexel's **Kamile Nacickaite** drove for a layup but missed, and JMU's **Nina Uqdah** got the rebound but was double-teamed and lost the ball out of bounds. Drexel, however, threw an errant pass on the in-bounds play, and Dukes' **Courtney Hamner** gained possession but was fouled.

Hamner was unable to convert the foul shot, and Marginean knocked down a 16-foot baseline jumper with 21.6 seconds left to cut the Dukes' lead to 54-53.

Then the Dragons committed their 10th foul of the half on Evans, who hit two free throws with 17.6 remaining to up JMU's lead to 56-53.

Crane drove for a layup and missed, and Evans got the rebound and was fouled with 11.5 seconds on the clock. She converted only the second free throw for a 57-53 lead.

Nacickaite knocked down a three-pointer with 4.8 seconds remaining to again cut the Dukes' lead to one, 57-56.

Evans was fouled again, with four seconds left, and her two foul shots put JMU up 59-56.

While attempting to inbound the ball, Drexel threw the ball away. Evans stepped to the line one more time, this time hitting her second foul shot, with 2.0 seconds left, for a 60-56 margin. Evans stole the final in-bounds pass by Drexel to end the game.

2008-09, GAME 32: Drexel 64, JMU 58

HARRISONBURG, Va., March 15, 2009 – Tournament most valuable player **Gabriela Marginean** scored 12 of her team-high 26 points during final two minutes to lead top-seeded **Drexel** (24-8) to a 64-58 victory over third-seeded **JMU** (23-9) in the championship game of the CAA Tournament at the JMU Convocation Center Sunday.

JMU cut a 16-point second-half deficit to 49-43 with 2:52 left in the game before Marginean scored all but three of her team's points the rest of the way, allowing Drexel to hold on to claim its first CAA title and the conference's automatic invitation to the NCAA Tournament.

The junior forward, who was the CAA player of the year for her regular-season efforts, scored on a layup with 1:56 left for a 51-43 Dragon lead and was a perfect 10 of 10 from the foul line during the final 1:36.

JMU got as close as four points on four occasions during the final minute, but Drexel followed by hitting on two free throws after each of the first three. The Dragons missed two free throws with 21.1 seconds left while leading 62-58, but JMU missed on two field goal attempts, and Drexel added two free throws with 7.5 seconds left for the final margin.

The victory was the Dragons' 16th straight since losing 60-56 at JMU on Jan. 18 in regular-season play.

Marginean hit on six of 15 field goal tries and each of her 14 free throws and was Drexel's only player to reach double figures in scoring.

JMU got a team-high 26 points from **Dawn Evans** and 16 from forward/center **Jalissa Taylor**. Taylor had seven points during JMU's 15-5 scoring run that pulled JMU from a 44-28 deficit to within 49-43, and Evans scored all of JMU's 15 points after the Dukes got to within six points.

Taylor tied her career scoring high and had a career-best 13 rebounds. She hit on five of eight shots from the field.

2008-09, GAME 32: Drexel 64, JMU 58 con't

After's Marginean's layup with 1:56 left, she hit on two free throws at the 1:36 and 0:55 marks, and Evans hit for three-point field goals at 1:44 and 0:56, leaving Drexel with a 55-49 lead. Marginean hit on two more free throws at 0:44 after a JMU missed shot, and Evans had another three-pointer at 0:34 to get JMU to within 57-52.

A free throw by **Andrea Peterson** at 0:34 gave Drexel a 58-52 lead, and Evans hit on two of three free throws with 29.5 seconds left to get JMU to within 58-54.

Marginean hit on two more free throws at 0:29 and Evans on two of three with 23.7 seconds to play, leaving Drexel with a 60-56 edge.

Evans hit on two of two foul shots with 22.1 seconds remaining to pull JMU to within 62-58, and the Dukes regained possession when Drexel's **Marisa Crane** missed two free throws 21.1 seconds left. The Dukes, however, couldn't score again.

JMU took a 14-7 lead and was up 16-8 with 11:28 left in the opening half before a 14-0 Drexel burst gave the Dragons a 22-16 advantage with 5:05 left in the half. Drexel went on to lead 28-22 at halftime and raised its margin to 44-28 just more than eight minutes into the final period.

Jasmina Rosseel had seven points during the 14-0 Drexel run. She hit on a free throw to get the Dragons to within 16-12, put them in front for the first time with a three-point field goal with 8:06 left in the opening half and added another three-pointer at 6:46.

Drexel shot 34.9 percent (15-43) from the field and hit on 30 of 38 free throws (78.9 percent).

JMU shot 34.0 percent (18-53) and had a 41-26 rebounding advantage, but the Dukes committed 17 turnovers to only nine by Drexel.

Named to the all-tournament team were JMU's Evans, Drexel's Peterson and Rosseel, Towson's junior guard Shanae Baker-Brice and Virginia Commonwealth's Quanitra Hollingsworth.

- ♦ The Dukes have won **69 of their last 77 home games**. The eight losses were to Delaware (3/3/05), nationally-ranked Maryland (12/20/08), VCU (twice, 1/20/08 and 1/11/09), UNCW (2/19/09), Drexel (3/15/09), ODU (1/17/10) and Hofstra (1/28/10).
- ♦ JMU has won **30 of its last 35 home games**. The losses in that stretch were to VCU (1/11/09), UNCW (2/19/09), Drexel (3/15/09), ODU (1/17/10) and Hofstra (1/28/10).
- ♦ In 2007-08 JMU held the **longest** active home winning among NCAA Division I teams at **30 games**. The streak ended with a 71-65 loss to then fourth-ranked Maryland on Dec. 20. It included four victories in 2007-08 and 13-0 records in each of the previous two seasons (2005-06 through 2006-07).

School-Record Attendance in Season-Opener

- ♦ JMU drew **2,530** fans for this year's season-opening game vs. Georgetown on Nov. 18, 2009.
- ♦ That was a **school attendance record for a home season-opener**.
- ♦ Previous high was 2,349 set last season vs. Radford.
- ♦ Dukes are averaging better than 2,000 a game for the third straight season.

Ice Cream Points

This is the third season in which JMU fans are eligible for a **free scoop of ice cream** from any Kline's Dairy Bar when the Dukes' basketball team scores 79 or more points in a home game.

The Dukes have hit the "ice-cream mark" in 15 of 39 games, sometimes in dramatic fashion. A three-pointer by then-freshman **Dawn Evans** with 40 seconds remaining vs. Towson (2/10/08) earned the fans ice cream in a 79-52 win. It took a free throw by then-freshman **Lauren Jimenez** with 4.3 seconds left to give JMU 79 points in a 79-39 win over **North Carolina Wilmington** (1/6/08). In JMU's upset of nationally-ranked **George Washington** (11/27/07), a three-pointer by senior **Jasmin Lawrence** with 12.6 seconds on the clock gave JMU an 80-55 win.

Two free throws by **Evans** with 7.6 seconds left clinched a 79-76 win over **Georgetown** on Nov. 18, 2009. In that game the Dukes rallied for 16 points down and did not take the lead until the final two minutes of the contest.
